### <u>APPROVAL – AMENDED AGENDA – LEGISLATIVE UPDATE</u>

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# <u>UPDATE – FY 2025 DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES BUDGET</u> <u>ANALYSIS</u>

Mr. Jeffrey Brown and Ms. Chantelle Green provided an overview of the budget issues and recommendations presented by the Department of Legislative Services during the MDTA's Fiscal Year 2025 legislative budget hearing. The overview also included a brief recap of the budget and the MDTA's responses to the issues raised in the budget analysis document.

### <u>UPDATE – LEGISLATIVE UPDATE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR</u>

Mr. Bruce Gartner updated the Finance Committee on the status of House Bill 1070 of 2024. Mr. Gartner advised the Committee that the House amended the bill in a manner that removes certain mandates and requires the MDTA to contribute \$750 million to the Transportation Trust Fund over a 10-year period. The amended bill also increases the MDTA's toll revenue bonding capacity from \$3 billion to \$3.75 billion.
