### I-95 Express Toll Lanes (ETL) Northbound Extension

This \$1.1 billion project will enhance the MDTA's efforts to provide a safe and reliable commute for its customers and advances the Traffic Relief Plan that Governor Larry Hogan announced in June 2018. In addition, the proposed improvements will increase quality of life for numerous communities with the addition of several new noise walls and will replace or rehabilitate multiple bridges that are more than 50 years old. The I-95 ETL Northbound Extension will be completed in segments and is expected to open to traffic through MD 152 by the end of 2024 and through MD 24 by the end of 2027.
