



I-95 ETL NORTHBOUND EXTENSION

UPDATE: Reconstruction of the Raphel Road Overpass at I-95

We are continuing to work on the new
Raphel Road overpass.

The new overpass will include:

- One lane in each direction, like today's configuration
- Stone pattern finish
- Water quality improvements
- Gated access ramps for authorized vehicles

The Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) will be extending the Express Toll Lanes (ETL) along northbound I-95 between MD 43 and north of MD 24, completing more than 10 miles of improvements. These important traffic-relief initiatives will benefit Marylanders throughout the Baltimore region by giving drivers a safer and more efficient commute. The I-95 ETL north of Baltimore have been very successful, and we are pleased to be able to deliver even more traffic relief.

In addition to the I-95 northbound roadway improvements, the MDTA will replace multiple bridges that are more than 50 years old and provide several new noise walls. The I-95 ETL Northbound Extension Program will be completed in multiple segments.



About Construction

Construction of the Raphel Road overpass began in March 2022. To provide a safe environment, the overpass was closed. All traffic has been detoured to the Bradshaw Road overpass. The new bridge was anticipated to be open to traffic by early 2023. Unforeseen underground conditions delayed the construction of the bridge foundation. This has required that temperature sensitive activities be shifted to spring 2023 and has resulted in a delay of re-opening to spring 2023.
