



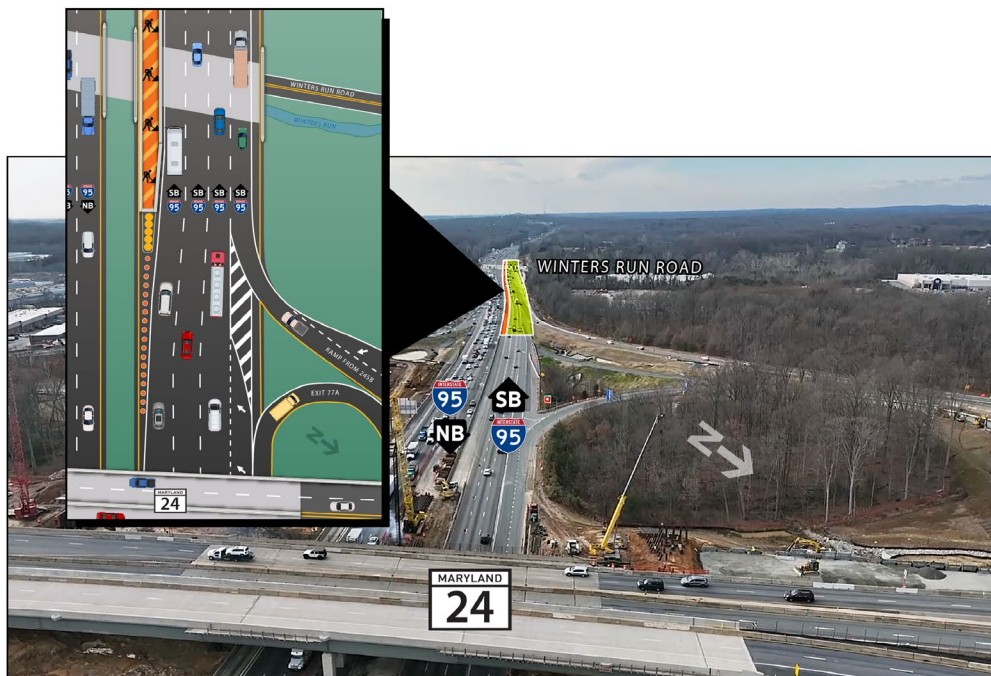

NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN ON SOUTHBOUND I-95 SOUTH OF MD 24 IN HARFORD COUNTY

Traffic Split Lifted; Work Zone Speed Limit Remains 55 mph

Baltimore (September 15, 2026) – On or about September 18, a new traffic pattern will take effect on southbound I-95 just south of the MD 24 interchange.

Since February 2026, traffic has operated in a split pattern, with a barrier wall separating the left lane from the right lanes. The new pattern will remove that configuration and shift southbound I-95 lanes to the right of the work zone. Barrier walls will separate traffic from crews in the work area.



To prepare for the new traffic pattern, the left lane on southbound I-95 will be closed overnight:

- Thursday, September 17, from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Friday, September 18.

Dates and times are subject to change due to weather conditions and other factors.

The work zone speed limit will remain 55 mph and Automated Speed Enforcement will remain in effect for the safety of workers and motorists.

The MDTA appreciates your patience and reminds drivers to slow down, stay alert, and use caution while traveling through work zones. Motorists should plan ahead and consider traveling off-peak hours to avoid delays.

The work is part of the MDTA's I-95 Express Toll Lanes (ETL) Northbound Extension Program between MD 43 and north of MD 24 that will help reduce delays and improve travel along northbound I-95 between Baltimore and Harford counties.
