NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN ON MD 24 BRIDGE AND NEW SOUTHBOUND I-95 RAMP AT MD 24 TO OPEN BEGINNING MONDAY, JUNE 29, 2026

WEEKEND-LONG RAMP CLOSURE WITH DETOUR IN EFFECT JUNE 26 - 29

Baltimore (June 18, 2026) On Monday, June 29, 2026, the MDTA will move into the next phase of construction of the MD 24 bridge over I-95 when a portion of the new MD 24 bridge will open to southbound traffic, marking the latest milestone in the I-95 Northbound ETL Extension Project.

Additionally, a new ramp from southbound I-95 to southbound MD 24 will open. This ramp has been raised approximately five feet at its connection to MD 24 to align with the new bridge structure.

With southbound traffic on the new span, **crews will be working behind barrier walls** to complete the remaining section, which is expected to open to northbound MD 24 traffic in approximately six weeks.



To facilitate construction, the off-ramp from southbound I-95 to southbound MD 24 (Exit 77A) will be closed from **10 p.m. Friday, June 26, until 5 a.m. Monday, June 29, 2026**. Traffic will be detoured to the off-ramp at Exit 77B and make a left turn onto westbound MD 924 before making another left turn onto the on-ramp to southbound MD 24. Crews also will close one lane of the southbound MD 24 bridge over I-95 nightly from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning, Friday, June 26 through Sunday, June 28.



Dates are subject to change due to weather conditions and other factors.

The MDTA appreciates your patience and reminds drivers to slow down, use caution while traveling through work zones, plan ahead, and travel off-peak to avoid delays as this critical work continues.

Work is part of the MDTA's I-95 Express Toll Lanes (ETL) Northbound Extension Program between MD 43 and north of MD 24 that will help alleviate delays and improve travel along northbound I-95 between Baltimore and Harford counties.

In addition to extending the northbound I-95 ETL, the program will replace several bridges that are more than 50 years old and provide new noise walls for adjacent communities.
