The I-695 Curtis Creek Drawbridge Rehabilitation and Resiliency Project is part of MDTA's preservation program to enhance safety and reliability along the I-695 corridor in Baltimore City, Baltimore County, and Anne Arundel County. This project will address structural repairs to the existing Curtis Creek Drawbridge and enhance traffic safety measures along the span. This work is being expedited to ensure completion before the Key Bridge Rebuild is completed and open to traffic. The project will:

- remove and replace portions of the concrete bridge and parapets,
- perform steel repairs to the existing superstructure and catwalk,
- clean and paint the steel superstructure in the repaired areas,
- upgrade lighting and traffic signals on the bridge, and
- install new pavement markings and signage.



Project Timeline:

Repairs at Curtis Creek Drawbridge are anticipated to wrap up in the summer of 2027.
