

I-95 Ramp Rehab

(South of the Fort McHenry Tunnel)

ONGOING WORK TO RESULT IN WEEKEND-LONG CLOSURES OF RAMP FROM SOUTHBOUND I-95 TO SOUTHBOUND MD 295 INTO SUMMER 2022

No Closures Will Occur on the Same Dates as Baltimore Oriole Home Games

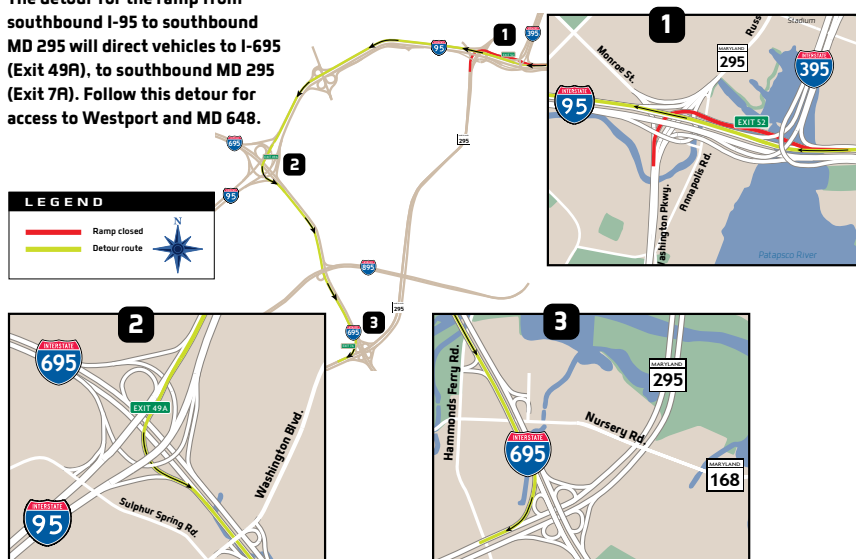
Weather permitting, the ramp from southbound I-95 to southbound MD 295 (Exit 52) will be temporarily closed **starting Friday, April 8, at 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, April 11, and continuing weekends into Summer 2022. Closures will not occur on dates when the Baltimore Orioles have home games.** In addition, when the ramp from southbound I-95 to southbound MD 295 is closed, the ramp from Hanover Street to southbound I-95 must also be closed during the same time frames.

Note: During the weekend closures, the ramps will be closed the Thursday prior from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning.



The detour for the ramp from Hanover Street to southbound I-95 will direct vehicles to turn right onto E. McComas Street, to E. McComas Street on-ramp to southbound I-95.

The detour for the ramp from southbound I-95 to southbound MD 295 will direct vehicles to I-695 (Exit 49A), to southbound MD 295 (Exit 7A). Follow this detour for access to Westport and MD 648.



Additional closures may be required to complete this work. MDTA will issue additional traffic alerts when dates are determined.
