


## I-95 ETL NORTHBOUND EXTENSION




Before the first stretch of the I-95 Express Toll Lanes (ETLs) opened in 2014, a study by the American Highway Users Alliance ranked this area of I-95, from I-895 to MD 43, on the list of the worst bottleneck locations in the United States.



- This first segment of highway also remained on the list of the top ten worst bottlenecks in Maryland until the I-95 ETL opened.
- The ETLs brought much needed traffic relief to one of the most congested portions of I-95 in Baltimore, removing the highway segment from bottleneck lists.
- The I-95 ETL Northbound Extension is located along northbound I-95 from MD 43 to MD 7. The extension to MD 152 opened to traffic in December 2024. The full extension is expected to open in 2027.



- In total, nearly 87 million vehicles have traveled the I-95 ETL, which is 95% more than original projections.
- In its first year of opening, more than 7 million vehicles used the I-95 ETL, exceeding the initial forecasts by 99. The highest volume year was FY 19 with 10 million vehicles, or 127% more than original estimates.
- In FY 24, more than 9 million vehicles used the I-95 ETL, which is 81% more than initial projections.



Providing Relief From Traffic Congestion


The ETL removed **5.7%** of traffic in FY 15 and **7.6%** of traffic in FY 24 from the I-95 general purpose lanes.
